Dear Boaters:

Welcome to our Canalfront Hospitality Program and our Welcome Center. We believe it the finest such facility on the canal and hope it will meet your needs. We have water and electricity hookups, restrooms, showers, laundry machines; an air-conditioned lounge with television, internet access, Wi-Fi; FAX machine, telephone, a DVD/VCR player; a book exchange; and a balcony overlooking the canal. We lend bicycles and wagons, no charge. A pump-out station is just west of the Main Street bridge. Borrow a CD and player for a tour of our Art Walk. Come on up, enjoy a cup of coffee, and make yourselves at home!

The Welcome Center is staffed by community volunteers seven days a week mid-May through mid-September to coincide with the dates the canal is open. When a Greeter is available, we are open 8am-8pm. The Greeters will give you access to the facilities, help orient you to the community, and answer any questions you have. Get quarters and supplies for the laundry machines from a Greeter.

For overnight stays with full access to our facilities there is a modest fee to help defray our costs: boats under 10 feet in length, \$4; 10-19 feet, \$6; 20-29 feet, \$8, 30-39 feet \$12; over 40 feet, \$15. If you don't need our facilities, you may tie up at our canal wall with no charge or permit. If you stay more than 48 hours in any calendar month and new arrivals need the space, you may need to move.

When you log-in at the Welcome Center, you'll receive a receipt (to be taped inside your windshield), and a keycard to access the facilities. When you leave, turn off the water with the spring valve and place the keycard in the drop box in the lower restroom.

We invite you to visit our historic downtown immediately adjacent to the canalfront at the Main Street bridge. We pride ourselves on our walkable village and our public art, including two historic themed murals. The Canalfront Greeter on duty can supply you with walking tour maps, shopping guides to the village, and a schedule of events.

Brockport's business district is thriving. We have a variety of restaurants, specialty and antique shops, book store, bank, post office, movie theater, pharmacy, ATMs, gasoline stations, convenient store, dollar store, beauty salons, bed and breakfast, etc. You'll find a business directory listed on the village website, www.brockportny.org. Immediately south of the village, one mile from the Main Street bridge, are several shopping malls (including a Wegmans) that can be reached by sidewalk.

The campus of the College at Brockport, State University of New York begins one block west of Main Street and two blocks south of the business district. Besides its many classroom and residential buildings, the campus displays many important art works. Clarkson Corners, with several historic homes, is one mile north of the Main Street bridge by sidewalk.
