The public shall be allowed to speak only during the public comment period of the meeting or at such time as recognized by the presiding officer.


- Speakers must be visible.




PURPOSE: To foster collaboration between the Brockport Central School District and Village of Brockport. We would like to reinstate a feeling of community into homecoming weekend.


VILLAGE OF BROCKPORT ROAD MAP

in Brockport in quite some time, and many community members have been advocating for the revival of this event. Brockport administrators would work hand in hand with the Village Hall to organize the parade. The

parade itself would be open to participants from both school and community organizations and clubs. Such a parade would surely foster collaboration between the school and community.

We would be willing to coordinate with local vendors, businesses, and residents to put out food stands or carts to sell food and drinks. We could also encourage local crafters or churches to sell crafts and bake sale items that can be sold at the parade. Promoting the parade would be relatively easy between word of mouth and the various newspapers, not to mention social media.

We could work with business sponsors to support the parade and the event. The schools are already working on floats, but we could also encourage businesses, community organizations, and churches to create unique and original floats to go in the parade.

We understand that this is short notice for this year's event but it may be the start of bringing back an old tradition and creating an event that would include community, school and college.

BROCKPORT HOMECOMING PARADE

2012 GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR FLOATS

PLEASE READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY

ENTRY OF FLOATS

1. All floats from community groups are entered free of charge.
2. All float organizers must complete an entry form and return it to the District Office.
3. Once your application has been received, you will receive a confirmation and instructions on where to bring the float on the day of the event.

YOUR FLOAT

2. It is the float organizer's responsibility to ensure that their float has the following safety items: somewhere for float passengers to sit or hold onto during travel, and a basic first aid kit. (not compulsory but advisable)
3. We must remind you that you must follow the Highway Code at all times when making your way around the Parade route. All loads or parts of the float must be secured and not likely to part company with the float at any time.
4. Please feel free to express yourself, however, use common sense and decency when planning your entry as this is a family friendly event.
5. The Brockport Homecoming Parade Council has the power to prevent any float from taking part that is deemed non compliant with these guidelines

FLOAT REGISTRATION

1. Please complete the form by September 28th at the very latest.
2. Late registration must be brought with you to the parade headquarters at the Brockport Fire Station by 5pm the day of the event.
3. In order to allow for fair and proper judging, participants must register to be eligible for an award. Registration is not necessary to march in the parade, but is strongly recommended.

ARRIVAL AT MARKET STREET FORM UP AREA ON PARADE DAY

1. On the day of the parade, you will be required to form up in the holding area on Market Street. On arrival, you will be required to check in with Parade organizers.
2. You will be issued a registration number - this should be clearly placed on the float. This will make the judging of the float easier for the float awards.

This is a drug free event. Alcohol is only permitted in designated areas. No weapons or harmful objects. The Brockport Police Department is kind enough to help us with security, so please do not make their job any more stressful. Please enjoy the festivities and help keep the parade headquarters at Brockport Fire Station clean. Submitting the registration acknowledges your responsibility and agreement to the above rules. Any violation will result in forfeiture of any award and may include banishment (from future parades, at least).

- A. We will ensure that the float meets appropriate safety rules.
- B. We will ensure that each animal is accompanied at all times by a responsible individual.
- C. We as float organizers will comply with the instructions of the parade organizers, which will be conveyed to us on the day of the Parade.
- D. We as float organizers will monitor, and will be responsible for, the safety and conduct of all individuals on or in the float.
- E. We realize that the parade has an official sponsors - therefore our float will not display logos or graphics of parade sponsor competitors, (Only banners promoting schools or clubs will be allowed).
- F. We acknowledge that the only permissible advertising on floats not requiring written approval from the parade organizers are signs written on the float, showing the vehicle supplier's name. (If in doubt, contact the parade organizers before the event).
- G. We will ensure that our float has secure side barriers, somewhere safe for passengers to either sit on, or hold onto, whilst the float is moving.
- H. We will observe the Highway Code at all times.



Second Quarter Report Highlights

Crime Trend Highlights:

- Throughout this quarter a number of vehicle larcenies have been reported. These larcenies occurred due to entry being made into unlocked vehicles and items stolen. People are encouraged to lock their cars and homes to prevent easy access by criminals who prey on crimes of opportunity.
- Brock the Port was held on May 6, 2012. It resulted in numerous arrests and calls for service however nothing serious occurred as a result of the event.
- I have attached all Media Release sheets relative to crimes that have occurred in the Village of Brockport and provided to the media on a weekly basis by Sergeant Mark Philippy and/or Officer Richard Cranston during this past quarter.

Miscellaneous

- Synopsis: During this quarter the Brockport Police Department, handled 3,979 calls for service, made 71 criminal and violation arrests, 7 DWI arrests, took 24 criminal mischief reports, 27 family trouble reports, 4 burglary reports, 6 grand larceny reports, and a number of other reports. In addition Brockport Police made 396 Vehicle and Traffic arrests that included 60 speeding tickets, 12 aggravated unlicensed operation tickets, 18 un-inspected motor vehicle tickets, 417 parking tickets, 143 village ordinance arrests and took 31 Motor Vehicle Accidents.

Mayor & Trustees,

For the upcoming board meeting I would like you to consider the following purchases. First off I will be asking for the remaining money to purchase the rest of the water meters. We have a little over 400 meters to purchase yet to finish out our meter upgrades. This would be the rest of the package that we had previously put out to bid. We have \$60,000 in the budget for these but we need an additional \$4,000 to complete the package. I have talked to Treasurer Hendricks and he stated that we can do an amendment.

Secondly I have discussed with my liaison the possibility of replacing our parks mower. We just recently had a breakdown of which we are waiting on parts for. The right side drive on our mower has disintegrated. The cost to replace it will be close to \$2,000. Without it, the mower is not only useless it is also worthless. I have authorized my mechanic to replace what is needed. My fear is the left side drive will go next and then we will be out another \$2,000 for a total of \$4,000. The mower is 7 years old with almost 1700 hours on it. To replace it will cost \$8,872.40 for a comparable one on state bid. If we were to do a municipal lease for 3 years then it would only be \$3,197 per year and we would own it in the end. We should be able to sell our old one and make enough to make the first year payment. Again I have spoke to Treasurer Hendricks regarding this purchase and he agrees with it.

Lastly, with the recent purchase of the new backhoe from the Water department fund, the unloading forks that we currently have will no longer fit the new backhoe without re-fabricating them. If we do re-fabricate them, then they will not fit our other equipment. So I would like to purchase a new set of forks to fit our backhoe. We use these forks on a regular basis to unload pallets of products as well as all kinds of pipe. Because they are specific to the Cat backhoe we would have to get them from the Caterpillar dealer in Batavia. These forks would be able to be used for at least the next 5 years because we are on the buyback program from Caterpillar. The cost of the forks are \$3,122. That money can come out of the Water fund as well. I have discussed this with Treasurer Hendricks as well and he is on board with it. If anyone has any questions regarding these purchases please feel free to call.
