Dear Park Avenue and Fayette Street neighbors,

Please note the changes in parking during the Main Street bridge closure shown on the enclosed diagram for Park Avenue. These changes will be marked with on-the-street signage that will go into effect with the closing of the bridge on April 3, 2023. Unfortunately, restricting parking is the only way to facilitate the flow of increased two-way traffic during the bridge closure on Park Avenue. We apologize for the inconvenience this will cause residents, especially those who reside between South Street and the Five Corners Stoplight.

Note that the diagram also includes information on Smith Street bridge traffic and the intersection of Fayette and East Avenues.

A crosswalk on Fayette at the south side of Barry Street is planned for the bridge closure.



VILLAGE THROUGH TRAFFIC/PARKING

Park Avenue Parking Changes

Beginning April 1, parking will change for 18 months in certain areas of Park Avenue to accommodate the heavier than normal north/south traffic across the Park Avenue bridge. Delivery trucks will continue to be able to make brief stops along the no parking areas to deliver goods.



Intersection of East Avenue/ Fayette Street DOT plans a three-way stop. Traffic volume, per DOT, does not warrant a stoplight.

Smith Street Bridge

Due to traffic level and Village ownership of the bridge, NYSDOT will not provide traffic assistance. Our online survey of residents on how to handle the bridge traffic overwhelmingly favored a stoplight at both ends of the bridge. Retired villageowned stoplights stored at DPW will, at a nominal cost to the village, be returned

to service to enhance the safety of traffic over the bridge. The lights will be installed a few weeks before the Main Street Bridge closure so drivers will have an opportunity to get used to them.
